Solo Supplement Payment Collection by BAC Office, Effective January 2nd, 2018. Effective only with BAC rides opening for registration today and in the coming months, members going on a ride who will pay the solo supplement fee (i.e., those going on the ride who will not have a roommate) should mail their solo supplement payment to the BAC Office – BAC, PO BOX 23998, San Diego, CA 92193 – rather than the Ride Leader. Your check should include a note indicating which ride it should be applied to. Please also be sure to include contact information (phone and email) in case there are any questions about where to apply your payment. The payment will be deposited by the BAC office and manually entered into the ride's "Payment Collections & Disbursement Summary" report so that the Ride Leader will have a complete record of funds collected and disbursed for their tour.

BAC Ride Leader Forum: On Tuesday, December 12th, 7pm EST, the Board hosted the first BAC Ride Leader Forum via teleconference which 36 Ride Leaders attended. The forum was well received and generated a number of suggestions for better support for Ride Leaders, all of which will be considered by the Board at our annual retreat in

March. The key takeaways from the discussion were: (1) Ride Leaders like the credit card payment system and await the ability to collect solo supplements via credit card, (2) Ride Leaders want more consistency in the ride review process, (3) new Ride Leaders need more support, (4) Ride Leaders want a chance to provide input to policy changes the Board is considering, and (5) Ride Leaders want more frequent opportunities to interact with each other and the Board.

Updated BAC Policies. The BAC Board recently updated the following policies: number of tours per calendar year that a member can lead, and ride "ownership". The full text of these will be attached to the December 2017 Board meeting minutes which will be posted to the BAC website in late January, available via the Docs link just beneath the BAC banner on the homepage. They are also being incorporated into the current revision of the "BAC Ride Leader Policies and Guidelines" which should be available in Docs in February.

Tip of the Month: Review and be sure you adhere to the BAC member standards of behavior: "BAC supports the concepts of tolerance, fairness, and acceptance of all members regardless of gender, ethnicity, religion, sexual preference or any other personal characteristics. BAC expects all members to treat others with respect, kindness and compassion, and to behave in a safe manner while on a ride. BAC does not accept harassment of any kind from any member, and can revoke membership for unacceptable behavior." VIEW FROM THE CHAIR (Karen Hass) February 1, 2017

Last year, 2017, was another busy one for BAC: we have nearly 2400 members; provided 29 domestic and 31 international tours for the membership; had 11 new Ride Leaders and 33 returning Ride Leaders; held another Ride Leader Seminar attended by 34 members; and held the first BAC Ride Leader Forum teleconference.

A hearty thanks to BAC's volunteer Ride Leaders, volunteer van drivers, volunteer Board members, our office manager, Nancy Bohnett, and our website developer Greg Corwin for their support throughout the year. A thanks to Bruce Nelson, who has done a fantastic job keeping the BAC photo slideshow fresh on our website's home page! Thank you also to the many members who pitch in to help our Ride Leaders during tours. BAC is a unique club, and it's the volunteers who continue to make it successful. I'm looking forward to another great year for the Bicycle Adventure Club. Happy touring to all of you!

The most recent update of the "BAC Ride Leader Guidelines" has just been completed and will be available within the month on the website via the "Docs" link. Significant changes since the December 2016 version include re-titling it to "BAC Ride Leader Policies and Guidelines," updating the ride "ownership" policy, and adding a policy for maximum number of rides led per year.

<u>Ride "Ownership" Policy (revision)</u>: Factors that the Board will consider when determining if the tour will be permitted if more than one tour is planned for the same area include:

• Whether the tour will appeal to the same type of rider, e.g. fixed based versus a point to point; vehicle moving luggage versus self-sustained (participants using paniers to carry gear); BAC rating (hilly and/or more than fifty miles a day of biking versus relatively flat and biking less than forty miles a day).

• Time of year (spring versus fall).

· Leader-directed tour versus one dependent on a commercial tour operator.

 \cdot The degree of overlap (e.g., communities visited, roads ridden) between the planned tour and the recent tour or another planned tour.

• How long it has been since the last BAC tour in the area even if the tour has not been formally "orphaned" by the last Ride Leader who lead it. Generally, if a specific tour has not been offered to the BAC membership in more than three years, the BAC Board will contact the Ride Leader who last led the tour and inquire as to their intentions to lead that tour again. If that Ride Leader declines to lead the tour again within 18 months from the date of inquiry, then that tour may be considered "orphaned" and the BAC Board may offer that tour to another Ride Leader.

• If one ride is full.

The intent of the restrictions for multiple tours in the same area is to reduce the likelihood of competing tours which could result in neither achieving the minimum number required to proceed, and to maximize the likelihood that future tours in the same area by Ride Leaders who have spent considerable time developing a tour, will continue to achieve the required numbers.

<u>Maximum Rides Led Per Year Policy (new)</u>: Club members are limited to being part of the leadership team (Ride Director/Coordinator, Ride Co-Director/Co-Coordinator) for no more than four (4) tours in any one calendar year. Multiple sections of the same trip are considered to be separate tours. BAC's strength is to have a many Ride Leaders as possible leading a variety of tours in the United States and beyond, whether it is one tour every couple of years or four tours a year, and not to rely too heavily on any one leadership team.

Tip of the Month

We hope you're finding ways to stay fit over the winter months so you'll be ready for your upcoming 2018 BAC ride! As I write this I'm in California enjoying riding for several weeks in the Paso Robles area – temperatures in the 60s and 70s, vs. 20s and 30s back home in Virginia. Getting away to someplace where it's warm enough to ride is one option, and some of you will be skiing, snowshoeing, or hiking to stay cycling-fit until springtime. The agenda and dial-in details will be distributed to active Ride Leaders and recent Ride Leader Seminar graduates the first week of April. If there are topics you'd like to suggest for discussion during a future Forum, contact the BAC office or any member of the Board.

Ride Leader Seminar: The 2018 seminar will be held in San Diego the weekend of November 2^{nd} through 4^{th} . Look for more details in the coming months. We're hoping to offer a week-long BAC tour in southern California either immediately before or after the seminar.

<u>Tip of the Month</u> — How do you decide whether to sign up for a tour that's caught your attention? First and foremost, <u>be sure you carefully read the entire Ride Description</u>! The Ride Leader includes a lot of detailed information in the Ride Description that should give you a good idea of what to expect on the tour. Don't hesitate to contact the Ride Leader if you have any questions. Pay close attention to the Ride Rating and think about whether you'll be capable of riding multiple days in a row at the average distance and climbing for that rating. Will you be able to manage any days described that are outside the daily averages? Another source of information for any ride you're considering is the BAC website's search function. Use it to look for previous tours in the same area, or to find rides led by the Ride Leader for any tour of interest to you. For tours in 2012 and later, you can check ride survey results for tours in the same area, or led by the same Ride Leader, as the tour you're considering.

VIEW FROM THE CHAIR (Karen Hass)

I'm honored to have been selected to serve a second year as Board chair for the Bicycle Adventure Club, and happy to announce the election of Brenda Cole as our newest Board member, serving as Vice Treasurer. Our incumbent Board members are Elizabeth Buckingham (Treasurer), Clarice Sackett (Secretary), and George Ellis (Lead Tour Reviewer), Kate Gordon (Website Manager), and Carol Anderson (Ride Leader Seminar Director). We all look forward to serving BAC's 2400 members and outstanding Ride Leaders in 2018!

I also want to thank outgoing BAC Board member Marty Fink for his service to the club for the past four years. Marty served as Ride Seminar Director, Lead Tour Reviewer, and on a number of ad hoc committees. If you see Marty on a BAC ride, please be sure to thank him for all his hard work on behalf of BAC.

Twenty-four BAC members (including the Board and Nancy Bohnett, BAC Office Manager) attended the Annual General Meeting (AGM) and Happy Hour in San Diego on March 15th. Among those present were long time BAC member Don Martin, and prior Board members John McManus and Bob Smith. During the annual Board retreat, which follows the AGM, the full Board met to review current policy, procedures, and governance, and set the agenda for 2018. Highlights from the Board retreat that should be of interest to BAC members include:

- Decision to increase in dues effective July 1st, 2018 Dues for new members will increase from \$25 to \$30 for a single and \$50 to \$60 for a double membership. Renewals will increase from \$15 to \$20 for single members and \$30 to \$40 for double memberships.
- Formalization of a process for soliciting member opinions for policy decisions the Board is considering.
- Approval of updates to the BAC Bylaws (posted to the website in "Docs") to incorporate the "Standards of Member Conduct" statement and make other revisions recommended by legal counsel.

The complete minutes from the Board retreat meeting will be posted to the website in "Docs" by the end of April.

Policy Change Under Consideration, Comments Due NLT 4/15/18. The Board is considering eliminating the liability insurance requirement for commercial tour companies assisting international BAC tours. The current requirement is for those companies to have a policy in place while they're supporting the BAC tour that provides coverage of up to \$1M per incident, \$2M aggregate, and names BAC as an additional insured party. During the time that this requirement has been in place, to the best of the Board's knowledge, no BAC member has filed a claim against any commercial company's liability insurance policy. The Board believes it is highly unlikely that a BAC member would ever file such a claim due to the level of effort and expense involved in dealing with an overseas insurance company. **Please email the BAC Office,**

office@bicycleadventureclub.org, no later than 4/15 if you wish to comment on this change the Board is

considering. Final Board discussion and a vote on eliminating this requirement will occur at the April Board teleconference.

If you've led a BAC tour in the last 5 years or have an approved tour on the schedule for 2018-2019, you'll receive an email with the teleconference agenda and dial-in number within the week. Tip of the Month. What can you do to help minimize the time it takes for your ride proposal to be reviewed and approved? Although the turn-around from proposal submission to approval can be as short as several days, it can take considerably longer if the proposal is confusing, ambiguous, or missing information. The following tips will help you draft and submit a ride proposal that has the best chance of being reviewed in short order:

1. Download and review the most current "Ride Leader Policy & Guidelines" (RLPG), budget worksheet (BWFA), and "Sample Ride Description" from "Docs" on the BAC website.

2. Use the "Sample Ride Description" as a "go-by" for organizing your proposal and ensuring you don't forget any necessary information.

3. Review all of the information on the "<u>Ride Proposal Requirements</u>" page on the website, available via the "Propose a Ride!" link. Take note of the statement, "**Description: Provide concise, complete information in less than 700 words**."

4. Include all information necessary to convince members of how great your tour will be, and for them to decide whether it's a good match for their riding ability and experience.

5. If you have a detailed itinerary, post it to "Ride Leader Docs" for your tour where it will be available to members on your ride at any time. You can email the itinerary to anyone considering signing up who wants more detailed information than is in the ride description.

6. Upload the budget for your ride, using the latest version of the BWFA, to "Ride Leader Docs". If you're proposing a commercially supported ride, also upload the agreement you have with the vendor.

7. Submit your proposal at a time when you'll be readily available to answer questions from the BAC Tour Reviewer and edit your proposal as necessary.

VIEW FROM THE CHAIR (Karen Hass)

Spring is finally coming to my neck of the woods, so I'm finally getting to do some riding outdoors! I hope all of you are having decent riding weather and finding time to get outside on your bikes as well. Perhaps you're even training for an upcoming BAC ride, or are even in the middle of one. We have two out of four April BAC rides in progress, and twelve rides starting in May!

Ride Leader Seminar, November 3-4th in Temecula, CA. The 2018 Ride Leader Seminar opens for registration today! If you've ever thought about leading a BAC ride but weren't sure where to begin, this is your opportunity to find out! Immediately following the seminar there will be a week-long fixed base tour, "Temecula – Where the Sun Breaks Through the Mist." You may want to consider signing up for both, but hurry, there are only 33 spaces available for the seminar and 34 for "Temecula – Where the Sun Breaks Through the Mist."

Ride Leader Forum Teleconference. The 2nd BAC Ride Leaders Forum was held on April 10th with over 30 ride leaders dialing in – thank you all for participating! The Board provided feedback on requests from the December 2017 forum, and there was extensive discussion about the adequacy of ride leader reimbursement, particularly for scouting leader directed tours in Western Europe. The next forum will be schedule in November or December. Anyone with a suggested topic for a future Ride Leader Forum, please send it to the BAC office, office@bicycleadventureclub.org.

Tip of the Month. When you finish a BAC tour, complete the "**Ride Survey**." It's helpful to ride leaders to know what members think about the tours they lead. After you've completed a BAC tour, you'll receive a reminder notice from the BAC office to complete the survey. When you log into your account on the BAC website, directly beneath the BAC banner you should see a blue box with a link to the survey for the tour you've just completed. You can also access the survey directly from the ride description page for the tour – look for the "Ride Survey" link to the left of the description. Tour Reviewers use the survey results to provide summary feedback to the ride leader during the tour debrief. Although all BAC members can see the overall star ratings for a completed tour's survey, the individual survey results and member comments are anonymous, and not viewable by the ride leader for the tour, other ride leaders, or any BAC members. Only Board members and the BAC office can view the individual survey results. The Board and office can also view all comments but cannot tell which tour participant provided which one – unless the member includes their name in the comment, of course! If you'd like to provide feedback to the ride leader or the Board other than via the survey, you can also contact the BAC office (office@bicycleadventureclub.org or 858-715-9510).

RIDE LEADER MENTORSHIP (Clarice Sackett)

The lifeblood of BAC is its ride leaders. Without leaders, we have no rides and without rides we have no club. Why not become a Ride Leader and lead a ride in your area? A recommended first step is to attend the Ride Leader Seminar, and the 2018 session is "going live" for sign ups May 1st. You'll learn everything you need to know from planning the ride, managing sign-ups, what you need to do before the ride starts, actually leading it, and closing out your ride when it's done.

Still feeling a bit intimidated? Look for a mentor to help guide you. BAC has lots of veteran, prolific leaders many of whom have mentored new ride leaders. Ask a leader you've ridden with and whose style you like. Ask your Tour Reviewer to serve as your mentor. Your Tour Reviewer is on your team from the beginning of the proposal approval process, as well as during the time leading up to your ride, while you're on the ride, through to the ride debrief two months after the completion of the ride. They're available to help sort out questions or issues that arise at any time. You can also ask any other member of the Board to serve as your mentor - you'll meet us at the Ride Leader Seminar. A technique several recent Ride Leader Seminar graduates have used is inviting their mentor to be the co-director or driver on the first tour they lead. Another technique is to lead a ride that has been led previously; the prior leader might agree to serve as your mentor. Also, look at the Ride Leader Policy and Guideline Handbook on our website. It's the encyclopedia of ride leading with all the information you need. Now get on your bike and scout out your route!

VIEW FROM THE CHAIR (Karen Hass)

Disappointed because you couldn't get onto a particular BAC tour? Take a close look at upcoming tours that still have space, even if they're in areas where you've never thought about riding before. Several of my very favorite BAC tours of all time are ones I signed up for as distant 2nd choices because I couldn't get on any of the tours I thought I'd enjoy since they were already full. Check out the "Rides with Space Available" section below and read the ride descriptions. I hope you'll find one that appeals to you "on 2nd thought," and ultimately provides you with a wonderful BAC cycling vacation!

Dues Increase Effective July 1st. Annual membership dues increase by \$5 on July 1st. Renewals will increase from \$15 to \$20 for single members, and from \$30 to \$40 for a dual membership. New membership dues will increase from \$25 to \$30 for single members, and from \$50 to \$60 for a dual membership.

Tip of the Month. This month's tip is for Ride Leaders and members who use "Ride with GPS" (RWGPS) for creating routes – maps, GPS files and cue sheets – for the rides they lead. In my experience with RWGPS I've been able to produce detailed, accurate cue sheets, but not without careful review and at least a small amount of editing. Once you've created a route, review it carefully to be sure all cues are correct and unambiguous. By selecting "Edit" mode, you can modify the route as well as the cues – turn direction as well as the notes that provide instructions for the cue. If you have a paid RWGPS subscription ("basic" or "premium") you can take advantage of the recently added "Cue Review Tool." The tool will step you through the route you've created, cue by cue, and allow you to make changes or corrections to any of the individual cues and add in custom cues or points of interest (e.g., places to stop for water or food, warnings on railroad track crossings, etc.). Tip of the Month: From the time you sign up for a BAC tour, you should prepare for the possibility that you may need to cancel. This is especially important if you have ongoing health or family issues that may flair up unexpectedly. When you review the Ride Description for any tour you're considering, pay close attention to the cancellation policy. If you have to cancel and the Ride Leader cannot fill your space, you may lose a significant portion of the tour cost. Even if your space is filled, you will lose the BAC ride registration fee and payment processing fees for any payments made before you cancelled. Note the statement in the cancellation policy that BAC encourages members to purchase trip cancellation insurance. Should you need to use your trip cancellation insurance for a BAC tour, contact the BAC office if you need proof for an insistence claim of payments that cannot be refunded.

VIEW FROM THE CHAIR (Karen Hass)

September is typically one of BAC's busiest touring months and 2018 is no exception: 24% of the tours offered this year start this month, with approximately 300 BAC members riding in them. Of course, this is also prime riding time in much of the US and Canada. Given these numbers, this is a good time to remind everyone to be safety-conscious whether on a BAC tour, or riding at home. BAC has a document on the website, "Riding Safe on BAC Tours," that

we ask our Ride Leaders to send to their participants prior to a tour. You can find it on the BAC website under the "Docs" link, in the "Tips and Helpful Hints" section. Here are a handful of tips for your consideration:

- Slow down and exercise extra caution when riding in wet conditions or on heavily shaded roads or paths, particularly going downhill and around curves.
- Wear bright colors, regardless of the weather. Many cycling apparel companies offer "high-vis" jerseys and vests.
- Use front and rear lights for increased visibility, even when riding during the daytime.
- Use a mirror so you can see what's behind you. You can purchase one that clips to your helmet, glasses, handlebars, or can be strapped to your arm or mount on the lens of your glasses.
- Use hand signals to let other road users (both cyclists and motor vehicles) know you're planning to turn, slow down, or stop. Although vehicular hand signals are relatively universal, if you're riding outside the US, be sure you know what's typical for that area. (Wikipedia "Hand signals" link: <u>https://en.wikipedia.org/wiki/Hand_signals</u>)
- If a line of cars is forming behind you, move off the road when it's safe to do so to let them pass.
- Carry a cell phone with you, and if you're in an area that uses something other than 911 for emergencies, program the number into your phone so that if you need to dial it, you won't lose valuable time trying to remember it.
- Stop and get off your bike to talk on your phone or take photos.

Tip of the Month: Before you head off on your next BAC tour, re-read the ride description and any informational emails from the Ride Leader one last time. Contact them with any questions you have – don't assume anything! While you're on the tour, offer to help out with happy hour, loading/unloading the luggage van, or any time the Ride Leader looks like they could use a hand.


Safety - Chapter 2 by Gail Husson

I've been a bit remiss in writing more articles about safety while cycling, but I was quite busy this summer riding the BAC Northern Tier ride with Rich Gallo and about 26 others. It was a fantastic trip! Anyone wanting more information, please contact me.

I wanted to bring to people's attention the issue of cattle guards. (This applies mostly to riding in the Western part of the US). Last summer, the brother of a close friend of mine died after a crash involving a cattle guard in Wyoming, while crossing into the entrance of a state park. He was a very experienced cyclist, but came upon a type of cattle guard that had vertical gaps between the sections of the guard. The gaps are wide enough so that a road bike tire can slip down between them, causing the bike to come to a sudden stop, resulting in the rider being thrown forward.

I distributed the flier (shown below) to the folks on our cross-country ride and talked about the issues at our map meeting. I sometimes still ride over cattle guards, but not before examining the structure and proceeding slowly.

Other areas of concern are steel deck bridges which can become very slippery when wet. I have walked my bike across them on occasion. And lastly, can be the issue of expansion joints in concrete bridges. Below is one example. If you search on "expansion joints in road bridges", you will find images of the various configurations. Again, there can be gaps wide enough to cause problems for a road bike, including pinch flats and rim damage. I remember encountering large expansion joints as we rode the bridge near Niagara Falls in Canada back into NY.

The four candidates for these two positions are listed below; please identify up to two of the four for which you'd like to assign your proxy. The Board Chair will vote the proxies as directed at the Annual General Meeting on February 21, 2019. You will need to have a current membership prior to December 13th 2018 in order to assign your proxy.

Jan Erickson (Winthrop, WA)) I have been a member in good standing with BAC since 2008 and committed to the philosophy of the mission statement; connecting members socially through organized tours, mutual respect for others, and members' independence and self-reliance with the adventure we all expect. It is important to pay forward and pay back. An organization cannot survive without its members' involvement. I consider myself as one who plays well with others and can look at the big picture for a good outcome of ideas. I have been a co-leader on four rides that Jim and I developed and led. Jim and I led three rides and one of our rides with another BAC leader. I am always willing to help other leaders while on rides. I have been on nine domestic and four international BAC ride. <u>Liability Insurance Changes Impacting BAC Member Drivers.</u> The Ride Leader Policy and Guidelines have long identified the minimum requirements for van drivers. Our insurance company is now requiring positive confirmation that anyone driving a vehicle to support a BAC ride has an acceptable motor vehicle record (MVR) and personal insurance that covers at least \$100,000 of bodily injury sustained by a single person injured in an accident, up to \$300,000 total for bodily injury per accident, and up to \$100,000 in property damage.

Membership Survey. Many thanks to the 939 members who successfully completed the recent membership survey between November 6th and November 20th. Data compilation and analysis is now ongoing. It is anticipated that this will be completed and a report drafted by mid January 2019. Germany this summer? Would you like to cycle around Germany this summer? Germany has an extremely high density of bicycle paths and it should be possible to make an entire trip on bicycle paths. I am a member of BAC looking for someone(s) who would like to cycle Germany with me this summer and who can speak and read enough German to keep me from getting hopelessly lost. (Note: this is not a BAC trip, just something I am interested in doing personally). I have found some great websites with many bike paths and nearby hotels but since I don't know German I feel insecure about flying over and trying this on my own. I'm currently suggesting starting in Copenhagen, taking the EuroVelo Route 7 to Berlin, then the Berlin Wall trail, then resuming the EuroVelo 7 to Dresden or Prague. Then I run into difficulty because of my limited German and map reading skills, I'd like to go west from Dresden to Lake Constance, which has a nice circumnavigating bike route. Please contact me David Rempel at <u>barrashee@aol.com</u> if interested to discuss further. We should be able to do 50 miles daily on relatively flat terrain.

Bordeaux to Alpe D'Huez (Intersecting Le Tour de France)–2020 Interested? This is just a feeler to see if there's interest in a 4C ride across Southern France in 2020. Point to Point. 13 days riding. Most days: 50-55 miles No estimate of the cost yet. This is just to see if there's interest in a tougher ride than most BAC rides.

The route would start in Bordeaux with two or three 1C rides through the Bordeaux wine country, near the Dordogne and Lot rivers. Staying or passing through St. Emilion, Bergerac, Rocamadour, Conques. About day six or seven the hills get more pronounced as we ride through the Central Massif and the Tarn Gorges. After testing your descending skills it's on to Avignon, and the Pont du Gard (a Roman aqueduct that the Tour de France will use in 2019). Moving out of Avignon the route is through Orange (with a well preserved Roman Theatre) or an option to go over Mount Ventoux. Then we move north through the foothills of the Alpes finishing with an ascent of legendary L' Alpe d'Huez. (The last day is only 35 miles, but 6000 ft of climbing. You should have your climbing legs ready by then.)

I also intend to intersect Le Tour de France, hopefully for a couple days. The problem there is that the 2020 Tour route won't be unveiled until October 2019. So to seriously watch the Tour itself we can't set a final ride route until October 2019. The best times for this ride would be July $5^{th} - 19^{th}$ 2020. But I'll need you to be flexible, until at least Oct 2019. If I were leading this tour in 2019, I'd intersect Le Tour in Nimes and Avignon, maybe even 3 days of watching.

I'll also need a co-trip leader and a driver. Preferably someone who speaks fluent French, has an EMS background, can drive a van in Paris rush hour, and worked as a bicycle mechanic once. While that unicorn might not exist in this country, it doesn't hurt to aim high. If interested contact Rich Olver richolver@comcast.net

Triple Bypass - <u>https://triplebypass.org/</u> July 13, 2019 While there are shorter ride options, the real Triple is 120 miles and 10,000 ft vertical. I'd say that that makes this a 6E ride rating.
